This week, meet Dr. Ramit Lamba: Developing state of the art low dose CT protocols!

As an HSCP radiologist at UC Davis, Dr. Ramit Lamba has been an important contributor to the academic performance and research collaborations in the department of radiology and beyond. With funding provided by the University of California Office of the President, Dr. Lamba was a key contributor to a 5 institution, three-year collaboration to evaluate, educate, and ultimately reduce radiation dose levels in computed tomography (CT) in the 5 UC medical centers. His clinical and technical understanding of CT has allowed him to develop protocols which maintain diagnostic performance but reduce radiation dose for CT imaging of the body. In addition to several high-profile publications in radiology journals, this work led to a recent (April 2017) publication in JAMA Internal Medicine.

Other published research by Dr. Lamba quantified scanner to scanner differences in CT grayscale performance, which has important clinical ramifications in body imaging. In addition to his own original research, Dr. Lamba has also been a solid coinvestigator supporting research by more junior (senate) colleagues in the department of radiology; with several peer-reviewed articles receiving special editorial recognition.

Dr. Lamba epitomizes the notion of the physician scholar, while supporting the day-to-day clinical mission of the department of radiology as an HSCP faculty member. He also heads the body imaging section of the department, providing important administrative and leadership functions to the department, the hospital, and the school of medicine.

Assistant and Early Associate Professors are encouraged to attend the upcoming, one-part mentee workshop.

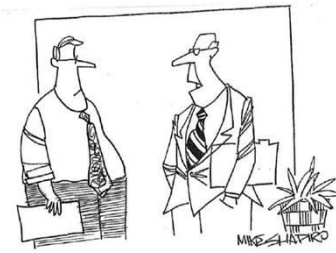
